I think the main aim of any youth exchange was reached: my participants came home feeling European citizens, with a better and more conscious and critic awareness of the big and diverse world they live in. They learned to communicate and build relations with people from different countries not caring about where they came from or what language they spoke. In eight days they have grown a lot, and they are conscious of this. I thank this project for that.

They also learned more about the power and effectiveness of non-formal education, something not used at all in our school system.

There were also some problems, which have been solved by the hosting organisation, but it took time and energy, and some tension could still be felt during the project.

It has to be said that all activities programmed on the info-pack and time table were done, but not as planned. For instance, my group was not given the chance to coordinate and present the two activities we prepared before our departure from our home countries as were asked in the info-pack, instead all the other teams did so. The activities that were supposed to be directed by us were instead hosted by the head of the hosting association, whom did not give me a clear explanation of such change of plan. But anyway my participants joined actively in those activities and gave their contribution.

There are also other few things that my participants highlighted me:

- the fact that at a certain point they started to get bored during the activities, for all they were doing was preparing role plays, and they wanted some diversity;
- they expected more from the activities, so they thought the activities could have been improved, with a variety of topics so that different skills could have been acquired (e.g. focus on advertisement for the development of digital and marketing skills);
- the fact that the good, positive, and stimulating environment created by the participants all together covered those not-positive aspects, so that the final and overall outcome of the project is positive.
